Crisp Packet Recycling Scheme - message from TerraCycle UK:

This means crisp packets can now be dropped off for recycling, along with all other types of flexible plastic, at any of these locations. In light of this progress, and after careful consideration, **The Crisp Packet Recycling Scheme will close this April.**

The last day school can accept empty crisp packets for recycling is 18th March.
