Would you like to join our Governing Body?

We currently have vacancies for two Foundation Governors on our governing board and we would like you to consider whether you could support school in this way.

Our governing board works together as a team and has the responsibility to do the following:

- Ensure clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction
- Hold the Headteacher to account for the educational performance of the school and its pupils, and the performance management of staff
- Oversee the financial performance of the school and making sure its money is well spent

As a Foundation Governor, you will specifically make sure that the governing board

- Preserves and enhances the religious character of the school
- Ensures that the school is conducted and led in accordance with its trust deed

The term of office is usually for four years from the date of appointment.

Time commitment varies but averages a few hours a month, visiting school and attending governing body meetings.

Anyone interested in the role of foundation governor should not be put off by a lack of experience. Appropriate training is available during the period of service.

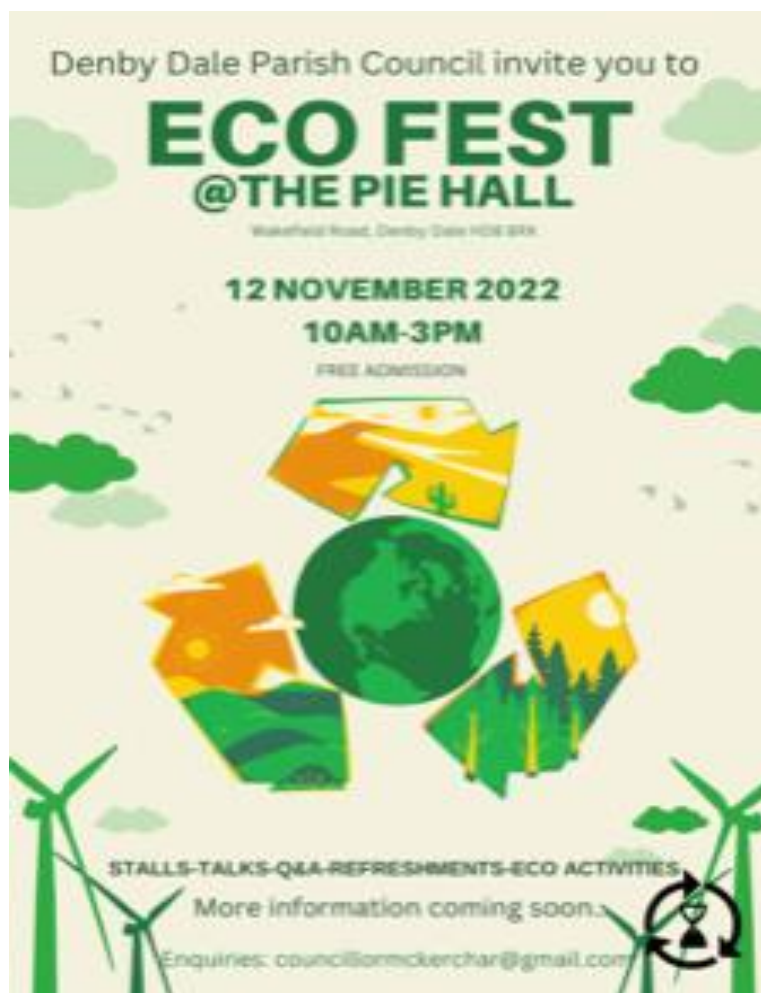
