

School Meal - Price Increase

A reminder - From September 2023 the price of school dinners will increase to £2.55 per day. Children in reception, Year 1 & 2 will continue to receive Universal Infant Free School Meals. Unless your family is in receipt of Statutory (means tested) Free School Meals, all children from Year 3 (in Sept) to Year 5 will need to pay for dinners and ensure that their dinner money accounts are in credit.

Freeze Pop Fridays

About the role As a governor, what will I do?

The governing board has a strategic role with three key functions: Approving the budget and overseeing the financial performance of the school to make sure money is well spent

Appointing and holding the headteacher to account for the educational performance of the school and its pupils

Ensuring clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction

As a governor you will not be involved with the day-to-day running of the school. Governors normally attend meetings in the evening, read and comment on reports and visit the schools to see first hand the impact of their work. We do support school events and help to raise money through events such as sleepovers, cinema nights, school fayres.

What's in it for me?

As well as being extremely rewarding, being part of a governing board will give you experience of working at a strategic level and the opportunity to learn and practice skills that have a direct relevance to employers. These include:

budget control
data analysis
staff recruitment
building relationships and networks
effective teamworking
