

Year One Maths Summer 2 Term Week 7 and over the summer holidays.

Week 7

Let's get confident with numbers.

Count to and across 100, forwards and backwards, beginning with 0 or 1, or from any given number,

To count in steps of and groups of 2, 5 and 10.

To use multiples to solve number problems (to count in groups of or steps of 2,5,10).



Don't forget to keep reviewing number bonds to 10 and 20 and doubling and halving facts, aim for instant recall of the facts.

What you can do with your child: 😊

Challenge your child to count on from any given number to another. Check they clearly say the number correctly especially 10, 20, 30 etc.

Use the BBC Daily Lessons (Maths) for additional support. The lessons from 8,9,10 and 11 June link to this objective of counting in groups/lots of 2, 5 and 10. These lessons usually have a video clip, game and a challenge. These may be useful for revision over the summer holiday.

There are seven pairs of gloves. Count in twos to find out how many gloves there are altogether.



How many fingers are there? How will you work out your answer?

There are seven pairs of gloves and seventy fingers in total. Did you find the answer by counting in ones, fives or tens?



I have eight sweets. I put two sweets in each party bag. How many party bags have I filled?

Think, pair, share.



I filled four party bags with the eight sweets.



Try to work out these word and picture problems using your super knowledge of counting in steps of 2, 5 and 10.

How many pairs of socks?



How many single socks altogether?

There are fourteen pairs of socks. How many socks are there altogether?



Try the following, it usually helps to draw out your answers.

If you had 5 pairs of socks, how many socks altogether?

How many toes would be in the socks?

Every box of chocolates has 10 chocolates inside. How many chocolates in total are in 5 boxes?

Sal is making 8 sandwiches. She needs two slices of bread for each sandwich, how many slices of bread does she need?

Sock answers - 6 pairs, 12 socks, 14 pairs, 28 socks. 5 pairs of socks - 50 toes - 5 boxes = 50 chocs, 8 sandwiches = 16 slices.

Can your child tell you about these words, what do they mean?
