Parking

Please remember that we can't park on the zig-zag lines on either side of the road outside school. We must all avoid parking immediately outside the school and of course bus stops and neighbour's driveways must be left clear. We know it's not always easy to find a parking space nearby but better to have to walk for a few minutes than put a child's life at risk.

We have had a complaint from a resident living in the small cul de sac on Dearnfield where some of the residents have found themselves 'trapped' at home by thoughtless parking. It is a narrow road and some of the householders are elderly, relying on their cars to go about their business. I am sure you can imagine their distress and upset when they are unable to go out because they can't get off their drive due to school visitors, perhaps attending Stars or a Class Assembly leaving their car parked inappropriately. The complainant has told us that they have contacted the Police to ask them to monitor the situation. Please think before you park.

You will be able to go and have a look in all the classes, talk to the children and find out what they are doing. Rainforest / Nurture Group

Many of you will have heard staff or children talk about Rainforest at Cumberworth so here's a very brief explanation of what our Rainforest is. It usually consists of a small group of about 6 children working with Ms Hewitt 3 or 4 times a week for around 12 weeks. The composition of the group is well thought out to create a balanced and functional group. Our Rainforest / nurture group is part of school's PSHCE (Personal, Social, Health and Citizenship Education) provision. The purpose of our Rainforest is to offer children opportunities to re-visit early learning skills and promote and support their social and emotional development. There is much research evidence to show that children's learning is most effective when they have a sense of emotional wellbeing, good self-esteem and a feeling of belonging to their school community. Our nurture room provides children with opportunities to further enhance these feelings and helps them to develop their maturity and resilience. Rainforest is a place of learning. We provide unconditional positive reinforcement. The knowledge and expertise that Ms Hewitt has is wide ranging and she has provided support and training to a number of local schools trying to establish similar groups. She is highly regarded in this field and very well respected by many local Head Teachers and other school staff, not to mention the rest of the staff here at Cumberworth.

Flu Immunisation for Yr 1, 2 & 3

The flu immunisation for Yr 1, 2 & 3 is scheduled to take place in school on 30th November. Whether or not you wish your child to be immunised it is important for the form to be returned by 21st September, either giving consent or ticking the reason for not wanting the vaccination.

Classes & Year groups

Over the coming weeks you will hear and see many references to different classes, year groups and Key Stages so we'd just like to try and help you understand them.

Class Hedgehog has Early Years children, also known as Reception Year group (EY or Yr R) and Year 1 children (Yr 1). This is Mrs Parry's class.

Class Owl comprises Year 1 (Yr 1) and Year 2 children (Yr 2) and Mrs Eason is the class teacher.

All Year 1 and Year 2 are in Key Stage 1 (KS1).

Class Atlantic - Mr McKay's class - is made up of Year 3 (Yr 3) and Year 4 children (Yr 4).

Class Pacific pupils are Year 4 (Yr 4) and Year 5 (Yr 5). They are taught by Mrs Barrett.

All Year 3, 4 and 5 are in Key Stage 2 (KS2).
