264. Review 2020/21 Data	 The Head Teacher reported that the Year 2 Phonics Autumn 2021 results have been published and the following was noted: 67% passed and a couple of pupils missed by just a few points which were expected as pupils with IEP and EHCP and being supported. The Year 1 screening was moved to Year 2 due to lock-down. Further screening has been in Year 3 and all, but 2 pupils are showing they would pass, and these have improved from a score of 14 points to 30 and 32 is a pass. Year 2 are due to take Phonics again in Autumn 2 so are checking for gaps and providing interventions. Pupils are not now falling behind which is good to see. A new Phonics scheme was needed, and Monster Phonics has been purchased. Q1: - Is the data quite typical of National outcomes? A1: - We are just below the National average and locally are similar to other schools, but in a small 	

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	school, small numbers make a big difference. It was noted that during lock-down phonics was sent home for parents to support their children the best they could as parents were not always sure how to teach phonics. Despite this the improvement now is amazing.	
265. Agree EYFS & KS1 Targets 2021/22	This item is to be moved to the next meeting due to recent Covid absences in staff. Baseline assessments have been completed but these are yet to be examined. It was noted that the cohort is boy heavy two third boys one third girls. Action 2: Agree EYFS & KS1 Targets 2021/22 is to be an Agenda Item on the next Children and Learning Committee. School Curriculum Update	 Mrs Horwood has accepted the additional role of Curriculum Development Lead with the aim to get all subjects to the same level as Science by supporting the other Subject Leaders. Links have been made with English Hub with Mrs Oliver taking the lead. School has been accepted into Yorkshire and the Humber Maths Hub lead by Outwood Grange Academy with Mrs Hurst taking the lead in school. Q2: - There is a big focus on Intent and Implementation will these come through in the Curriculum Development? A2: - Yes, the S-plans are followed for Teachers and pupils which set out planning, key questions, look at examples of work which are displayed and review of previous weeks work. Looking at impact and assessment, impact on pupils and also aiming to include pupils' voice. It has been very stop/start over the last 2 years, but we are a lot further on now than where we were 2 years ago and are progressing well now. A new Synthetic Phonics Program was needed and so Monster Phonics has been purchased which has been found to be very engaging for all children and particularly boys. It is based on different monsters and colour coding. Monsters feature heavily, silent letters are white and tricky sounds are coloured. Everything links to a monster or character. Lessons, planning, 	

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	assessments, interventions and training are all included with each lesson having a power-point, video and activity. A lot of resources are also provided including books with colour coded words. Sounding and blending are improved after only 4 weeks. Q3: - Is there an aspect that can be shared with parents? A3: - It would be helpful to have parents in for a session but needed to train Teachers, Support Workers and volunteers and match resources to Monster Phonics and get the program up and running first. It does need parental involvement. Action 3: The Headteacher will ask about a parent log-in.	Headteacher
	It was noted that there are also e-books but at a cost.	
	 Q4: - Do we implement any Phonics for older year groups? A4: - Yes, in Sycamore Class interventions are run for those that need it. There are Phonics interventions in Year 3 where there are gaps to plug and also look for other methods to meet individual's needs where appropriate. In Years 4 and 5 we look at why there is a need and look for an appropriate solution. 	
	Mrs Oliver has been with English Hub to see how Reading is taught. Governors are looking forward to future feedback.
