 Language & Literacy: This half term we will be learning about: Writing from the viewpoint of different characters using 'Arthur, High King of Britain' by Michael Morpurgo as a stimulus Narrative poetry- The Lady of Shalott. Recognise and use square numbers and cube numbers and the notation for squared (2) and cubed (3) Solve problems involving multiplication and division including using knowledge of factors and multiples, squares and cubes.
