### Core Books





During this half term our project, 'Fire, Fire', focuses on our learning in History, discovering the key events of the Great Fire of London as well as learning about significant people such as Samuel Pepys, Christopher Wren, King Charles II. As well as learning about Guy Fawkes and the Gunpowder Plot during general discussions about Bonfire Night and Firework safety.

We explore what it means to have traditions and celebrations.

The children will learn about different religious celebrations including a focus on Diwali and Hindu traditions. We will also look at different birthday celebrations and discuss the children's' memories of their birthdays so far.

We, of course, have a big focus on Christmas this half term. We will be reading, learning and retelling the story and teachings of the nativity and exploring the Christian meaning

of Christmas. We look forward to welcoming you into school

and presenting our Christmas performances!
