Key Questions/Issues for Governors to explore:

I have no direct questions to be answered at this time but I would encourage other Governors to attend one of our collective worships to see for themselves. The church school lead outlined the objectives and where they would lead us. The lessons are well prepared in advance according to the level of learning in the year groups. All classes have Care tables which are changed regularly. Any issues are brought to the head teacher by the church lead and discussed then actioned. Any relevant issues would be brought to the governor if needed.

Governor's Observations/Evaluation

Collective worship happens every day at different times to fit into the school day. Every year group from years 1/2 have the opportunity to lead the worship choosing their own theme, sometimes relating to the church calendar. I enjoyed my worship and observed the pupils that interacted when appropriate and showed respect to the class leading the worship. Pictures and words on screen helped and showed the theme of the day. There is a lot of hard work that goes into producing a collective worship and lots of opportunity to learn. Pupils of different faiths join in the worship to learn and if appropriate they leave at certain places in the worship. This is accepted and seen as normal behaviour throughout our school. We have a wealth of opportunity and ideals to learn from within our classes. Pupils left the hall quietly and in an organised manner at the end of the collective worship.

Culture observed in the school

Pupils show respect to others, polite behaviour to everybody. They know our care code, observe it and can tell you it as part of their school day.

Any Key Issues Arising for the Governing Body:

No issues relating to R.E subjects learned in our classrooms. Pupils feel happy with the way it is taught by the teachers.

Action Following Governing Body Meeting:

Follow up visits are always a good way to track progress and learning. I will be booking another visit in the spring term for a catch up. It is always an honour to visit school and be shown how our school progresses and helps pupils move forward.
