Dear Parents,

I hope everyone is safe and well. I am sure that you will all have seen the information about schools reopening in September. We will be so pleased to be able to welcome all the children back.

### September school reopening

At the moment we are working on the detail of our plans and our risk assessments. Following the guidance from the government there will still be some changes to how schools are organised normally and we will be letting you know about these as soon as possible. Changes will include:

- Staggered start and finish times for each class
- One way system in the school grounds- entering the grounds on Church Road and leaving through on Commons side
- Only book bags may be brought to school- no backpacks, pencil cases, mobile phones
- Packed lunch bags- these need to be hard plastic so they can be easily cleaned or please send your child with their lunch in disposable packaging.

If you have more than one child at school and they have different starting times, then please use the **later time**.

We will be able to run Breakfast Club and Rascals. Our other after school clubs will **not** be starting in September. These will resume as soon as possible. We will let you know when we arrange the dates.

The government will give an update about school reopening during the summer holidays. Schools and local authorities are not given advance notice of any changes so we will hear about it at the same time as everyone else. If there are any changes we will be in touch. We are all very much hoping that we will be able to get back to a 'new normal' as soon as possible.

### Transition

Normally at this time of year the children would be spending some time with their new class teacher so they can start to get to know them and make those positive relationships. We know that this is something that helps the children settle into their new classes.

When we come back in September the children will be going back into their 'old' classes for a few days to be able to return to school to a familiar setting and say their 'goodbyes'. They will then be able to move into their new class.

### Staffing update

We are delighted that this week we have welcomed back Mrs Baker and Mrs Clayton from maternity leave. A big 'thank you' to Mr Sykes, who has covered Mrs Baker's maternity leave in year 5.

### End of Year Reports

Annual reports for each child will be available from **Monday 13<sup>th</sup> July**. The reports will reflect the work of the year. If you would like to collect your child's report please come to the school main office from 9.30am. Reports that haven't been collected by the end of the day will be posted out to you.

Information accompanying the reports will explain what class your child will be in next year. If you would like to speak to your child's classteacher about the report please email using the ks email addresses and staff will be in touch.

## Summer Reading Challenge

We are running our Summer Reading Challenge again this year and we really hope you will encourage your child to take part. The Reading Challenge will need to be completed over the Summer and returned to school by Friday 11th September.

- Children who read 6-9 books will receive a certificate and a ticket to enter into a draw to win one of two £5 book vouchers.
- Children who read 10 or more books will receive a reading medal and a ticket to enter into a draw to win one of two £10 book vouchers.
- The class who have the most entries will receive £50 to spend on books for their classroom.
