English

Class Book: The Fastest Boy in the World – written by Elizabeth Laird

This half term the children will be studying:

- How to write a detailed recount & newspaper report. Children will look at newspaper articles and attempt to work out which parts are fact and which are opinion. They will look at the organisational features of a newspaper article (introduction, paragraphs, quotations from witnesses, sequencing of events signalled by time connectives)

Reading – in addition to our class text, the children will have daily guided reading session, story time and ERIC time.

Maths

This half term the children will be studying:
Area of rectangular and non rectangular shapes by counting squares.

Multiplication & Division

- Reasoning and problem solving.
- 6x 9x 11x 12x multiplication & division facts.
