English

Class Book:

This half term the children will be reading the books and A Lion in Paris and Fly Eagle Fly

They will be writing a non-fiction persuasive leaflet, monologue, poem and play script.

We will focus on handwriting and accurate use of key punctuation.

We will look at sentence structure and extending our ideas and vocabulary.

We will focus on reading fluency and comprehension.

Maths

This half term the children will be studying:

Addition and subtraction skills – consolidating and extending our understanding

Multiplication and division – consolidating our understanding of these concepts, looking at how to use the inverse to help our calculating.

We will continue to focus on our multiplication tables and developing our reasoning skills in maths. We will consolidate our previous learning by use of Flash Back 4, a daily fluency resource.

How can I help?

- Help me learn my timestables to 12x12. Remind me to use TT Rockstars 5 minutes for at least 4 times a week at home. This will earn me extra dojos. Be aware of what I am doing when I am on the computer or telephone. Help me tell the time to o'clock, half past and quarter hours on an **analogue** clock.
- Listen to me read every day. Ask me questions about what I have read and talk to me about words I am unsure of. Please sign my Reading Record Book when we have read so that I can gain reading challenge dojos and an extra playtime.
