

Background:

The literacy and numeracy catch up premium gives all state funded schools additional funding to support Year 7 pupils who did not achieve the expected standard in reading or maths at the end of Key Stage 2.

Funding for 2017/18:

Funding is allocated in March each year based on the Autumn Census. For this academic year we received a total of £10,723.
