

Sports Premium is allocated to schools based on the number of pupils on roll in years 1 to 6 recorded in the January Census. Schools with 17 or more pupils receive £16,000 plus £10 per pupil. Southgate School had 27 on roll at the time of the census attracting a total of £16,270 of Sports Premium.

Southgate School received two instalments: £9,490.83 30 October 2018 and £6,779.17 30th April 2019, to use across the academic year to make additional and sustained improvements to the quality of PE and sport on offer and to facilitate pupils being active during break times.

An outline of our sports premium spending is in the table below (a full breakdown is available on an Excel Spreadsheet):

The staff involved are able to deliver PE to their own classes which is crucial in our growing school as the number of classes exceeds the number of sessions that our specialist PE teacher is able to deliver (only delivering PE 1.5 days per week)
£570.00	This funded a dance coach to come in on Tuesday afternoons to provide enrichment.	This session has proved very popular and has been very well attended by pupils of all abilities. Teachers and support staff attend and have been able to lead sessions themselves.
£352.50	Membership of Pennine Sports Partnership	This has provided guidance and ideas which have supported the development of teacher resources (see below) and improving the delivery of PE. We have accessed a number of competitions and sporting events through the partnership.
£50.00	Interschool Competitions	Competitions are a very worthwhile investment for our pupils. The different environment and challenges that they have to overcome helps to develop in many social and emotional areas and they build on their communication skills.
£2,506.85	Sport, PE and play resources Including: High Jump equipment £150 Varying size/weight balls £140 Exercise mats £100 Benches £200 Trampets £60 Target Game £150 Scooters £100	Differentiated equipment has been invested in to meet the varying needs of our pupils. These have included different sized bats, racquets, balls, etc to further provide improved access to more activities. Sensory equipment has been invested in to meet the varying needs of our pupils. Equipment to encourage active play during break times has been purchased to store in the shed, previously purchased, to provide ease of access to pupils.
£3,343.86	Staff time (6 hours per week) Cycling	This has enabled pupils to access small group cycling tuition both on and off-site, as appropriate for pupil groupings. This activity has been particularly popular with our pupils and will continue next year.

£3043.49	Staff time (3 hours x 4 weeks ROKT + 6 hours Canal + 3hrs Cliff House+ 60 hrs + £1886 Calvert Trust)	Primary aged pupils have been provided with opportunities to experience caving and climbing at ROKT activity centre in addition to a canal trip, a trip to Cliff House, a full week at Calvert Trust to enable our physically disabled pupils to have access to more activities and mixed group walking.
£171.48	Slide – 2 days overtime	The pupils now have a slide within the Forest School area this has added to the experience of the pupils in this pupil-led activity.
£500.00	Transport - Funds used to support the use of the school mini-buses for pupil trips out to provide opportunities to be physically active.	The mini-buses provide transport to enable our pupils to access the swimming offer twice each week, planned activities provided by our Outdoor Leaders and class trips. Many of our pupils would not be able to access the wider curriculum without this transport.
£3,343.86	Staff time - Intervention staff member to support Swimming	The emotional and practical support of the Intervention Team, in addition to class staff, enables the pupils to make this transition to access swimming lessons. This is a valuable and meaningful element of pupil learning and development.
£202.07	Maintenance of white lines	This enables the on-going use of the sport courts.

Plans for Sports Premium Spending 2019/20:

We are investing the time of a specialist PE teacher for 1 day per week to train class teachers to deliver quality PE that meets the needs of all pupils.

We will continue to invest in resources that will support active play at break times to enable us to meet the government's criteria of every pupil being active for at least 30 minutes every day.

We will invest the time of our qualified Forest School Leader to guide and support class teachers to use the Forest School area for active learning with their classes.

We are exploring the benefits of investing in Active Maths and Active English to enable core subjects to be delivered through physical activities.

We are running cycling sessions every Monday to support all our pupils to learn to ride a bike, (half-day).

We will expand on our enrichment offer and add a football club that will run on a Tuesday afternoon alongside the Dance Club.
